WHO IS IGNORANT?

Few of us would put our hands up to this question, yet to be ignorant is to lack knowledge and awareness. If we change the question, WHO IS IGNORANT OF THE PROMISES OF GOD TO HIS CHILDREN? Some of us can honestly hold up our hands, while at the same time acknowledging that we have a sense of Gods promises to us, but can't explain it. If like me, you find yourself in this group, then you'll be happy the scripture readings of this week offer three gifts towards



understanding. An invitation to step forward, encouragement to change, and a truth that will sustain us going forward.

The invitation is in the first reading "Who is ignorant? Let them step this way.. leave your folly and you will live, walk in the ways of perception" The second reading contains encouragement, "This may be a wicked age, but you can redeem it...be filled with the Spirit.." The Gospel contains a truth that will sustain you now and in the future if you embrace it "...anyone who eats this BREAD will live forever."

This invitation, encouragement and truth will, if we embrace it, reveal to us as children of God, a new way of seeing the world of interaction with others. It will lead us to be what God wants us to be, His Children, for that is what we are destined to be. Through our profession of faith as baptised people we are his hands, feet, voice in the world. Partakers in the Eucharist we are humbly imploring his mercy, that we may merit also to be coheirs in heaven ...for ever. O God, who has prepared for those who love him and strive to represent him on earth...we pray, with the warmth of your love, that as we strive to live and love you in all things and above all things, we may attain your promises... Amen
