Rethinking Lent 2025

As children we were taught that Lent was a time to give up things. We understood Lent as time to deprive ourselves of earthly pleasures for the good of our souls. As scriptures tells us, when I was young I thought and acted as a child, now that I am an adult, I must think and act as an adult. The challenge is, that as we grow in age we should also grow in Faith. We can only grow in Faith if we give time and space to growth. This is not always easy as it demands we think deeper about our calling as followers of the Risen Christ. We are a pilgrim people on the move, striving to reach our destination, to be at home with God. If we just continue to do what we always did, then it's possible that there will be no growth, no greater understanding of our mission as Christians. Pope Francis has asked us this year to be people of Hope. Not just hope for those around us but for the world. How can we be people of hope, if hope is not reflected in our actions and lives. Today we are aware that Pope Francis is unwell and is battling with illness. We need to take up his challenge, and the calling of Christ to be a pilgrim people of hope and a sign to the world. What could this look like? Instead of just giving up something this Lent, why not take up something as well, and be a sign of hope to the World!

Perhaps you could say a prayer with your family or a friend, in person or on the phone? Maybe you could write a letter a week to a person you used to be friendly with and with whom you have lost contact? How about collecting smiles, purposely go out of your way to smile and say hello for a set number of times in the day to strangers you meet? Smiles are infectious, imagine if Carlow got infected with people smiling and being kind to each other? What a sign of hope! A final suggestion, why not take this newsletter home and have a discussion about "Rethinking Lent 2025". You will probably come up with better suggestions, let us know what they are and we will put them in next weeks newsletter. Blessed Lent!

Lent in the Cathedral 2025

Ash Wednesday; Ashes will be available this Wednesday at the 7.30, 10am and the 7pm Masses. Ash Wednesday is a day of fast and abstinence.

The Disciplines of Lent; During Lent we are called to "Repent and believe in the Gospel", through prayer, fasting and Alms giving we turn to the Lord. We also can mark Lent by a "Reverse Challenge", rather than giving something up, why not take something on!

A Tree of Hope will be placed in the Cathedral for Lent. You are invited to tie a purple ribbon on the tree symbolising what you need to let go of, or bring to life, this Lent The Stations of the Cross will be prayed after the 10am Mass on the Mondays of Lent. <u>Diocesan Pilgrimage to Luxembourg honouring Carlow</u> Trained St Willibrord

Join Fr Thomas O'Byrne and our ecumenical friends from the Diocese of Leighlin as the Diocese and the Cathedral Parish travel to Luxembourg to partake in the Annual Hopping Procession in honour of Carlow trained St Willibrord, Patron Saint of the Netherlands and the First Apostle of the Netherlands, from Sunday June 8th to Wednesday June 11th, 2025. St Willibrord spent twelve years in Co Carlow at Rath Melsigi, in the Parish of Tinryland, before leaving for the continent in 690AD. He is highly regarded in Belgium, Germany, Luxembourg and the Netherlands. Every year the town of Echternach, where he is buried, holds a centuries old UNESCO World Heritage Status Hopping Procession in his honour. The procession is known as the People Who Pray With Their Feet. In 2017 the people of Echternach presented Carlow Cathedral with his Relic.
