Lent — An Opportunity to Dig!

The buds on the "Tree of Hope" in the sanctuary of the Cathedral are bursting open, new life, new hope, new spring!

God saw all that was created and found it very good.

Creation calling us back to the Creator God!

The God who blesses, sustains and sees goodness.

Our "Tree of Hope" is not a mere branch cut down, but a living tree.

We see the branches laden down with the ribbons, signifying our "letting go" and "taking on" this Lent.
