However, Pope Francis has asked each Bishop to nominate a site of pilgrimage in each Diocese. Bishop Denis has nominated Saint Bridgit's Church Kildare A way to embrace the Pope's request is to make a formal pilgrimage to

St Bridgit's. This journey should be distinct and should be noteworthy for several characteristics: They are slow; they show movement; they contain purpose; they are defined by prayer. The themes of this Sunday's readings show many of the same characteristics. Thinking of Lent as a pilgrimage has the potential to be a helpful way to begin reflections on the Sunday's readings.

Filled with the Holy Spirit, Jesus returned from the Jordan and was led by the Spirit into the desert for forty days, to be tempted by the devil" (Lk 4:1-2).

To help on your local pilgrimage or reflection you might consider the following questions.

Who models the well-trained disciple today?

What areas need attention in your own spiritual pilgrimage?

Where is the place in your life that needs to slow down during Lent to make room for Christ?

What could I take up that would reflect my new journey of renewal?

Remember, a pilgrimage is slow, changes in our habits and lives also come slowly. A pilgrimage shows purpose. This Sunday's is quoted in the Gospel passage, the shadowy figure who tempted Jesus in the wilderness. Luke's presentation of the temptation of Jesus is unique. Each Gospel presents a purpose for Jesus' life mission. Luke makes a substantial effort to show that Jesus held the credentials for his messianic role. Luke's infancy narrative has already set the tone. The temptation in the desert, as Luke described it, showed a well-prepared Jesus who was ready to embrace the role of Messiah and Saviour. As he entered this desert scene, it was never a real possibility that the devil would get the upper hand. Instead, the scene revealed how capable Jesus was in facing the obstacles that stood in the way of his purpose. The devil cannot stop God's momentum. On our pilgrimage, we join with Jesus in trying to bring about change, and to witness to the glory, goodness and Love of God in the world.

A pilgrimage is defined by prayer. It remains the key to a Lenten pilgrimage marked by slowness, movement and purpose. We pray that you have a happy and prayerful Lenten Pilgrimage.

# **Diocesan Pilgrimage to Luxembourg honouring Carlow Trained** St Willibrord

Join Fr Thomas O'Byrne and our ecumenical friends from the Diocese of Leighlin as the Diocese and the Cathedral Parish travel to Luxembourg to partake in the Annual Hopping Procession in honour of Carlow trained St Willibrord, Patron Saint of the Netherlands and the First Apostle of the Netherlands, from Sunday, June 8th to Wednesday, June 11th 2025. St Willibrord spent twelve years in Co Carlow at Rath Melsigi, in the Parish of Tinryland, before leaving for the continent in 690AD. He is highly regarded in Belgium, Germany, Luxembourg and the Netherlands. Every year the town of Echternach, where he is buried, holds a centuries old UNESCO World Heritage Status Hopping Procession in his honour. The procession is known as the People Who Pray With Their Feet. In 2017, the people of Echternach presented Carlow Cathedral with his Relic.
