Listen!

Today's Word of God, especially the Gospel, draws our attention to the need to listen to the voice of the Good Shepherd, Jesus. An important question immediately arises. How can we recognise His voice amid the noise of everyday life? We need to be careful! If we do not strain our spiritual hearing, this voice may escape us, and we may not recognise the voice of the Lord. Only those

who practise listening to the shepherd's voice, who try to 'tune in to the frequency on which he broadcasts', will be able to hear him and, consequently, follow him to fertile pastures, to a safe haven where we will not perish for eternity and no one will snatch us from Jesus' hand. We 'tune in' to this voice when we meditate on the Holy Scriptures, when we pray, and especially when we participate in Holy Mass. At that time, Jesus speaks to us, teaching us to recognise His voice...



Sheep listen to My voice; D know them, and they follow,
D give them eternal life, and they shall never perish;
no one will snatch them out of My hand.

A great crowd of the saved heard and followed the Lamb of God, obtaining what the Lord had promised. We too are called by this sweet voice, but it is up to us whether we hear it and follow it... Let us reflect today on what we are really listening to, what voice we are following, and whether it is the voice of the good shepherd. May it be so, for only then will we be able to find true happiness.
