When Will This Happen?

"When will this happen?"

It's the question the disciples ask when Jesus foretells the destruction of the Temple. And perhaps it's the same question many of us ask, in our own ways, when life feels uncertain:

"When will this end?"

"When will things get better?"

"When will peace return?"

The longing to know is deeply human. We want clarity, control, timelines.

Yet Jesus doesn't give his disciples a calendar or a countdown. Instead, he gives them a calling: "Take care not to be deceived... do not be frightened... bear witness." In other words, Jesus shifts their attention from the future to the present — from speculation to faithfulness. The question is not when the world will end, but how we are living now, in the world as it is.

"When will this happen?" becomes, in the light of faith, "How shall I live in the meantime?"

We live in a world of uncertainty — wars, divisions, and moral confusion — not unlike the one Jesus described. Yet his words are not meant to paralyse us, but to prepare us. He assures us that even in chaos, God is still

writing His story. The stones may fall, the structures we trust may crumble, but the presence of Christ endures.

Our task is not to predict the end, but to remain faithful until the end.

To keep loving when others give up. To keep speaking truth when it's easier to stay silent. To keep believing when hope seems dim.

And perhaps that's the real answer to the disciples' question. The "when" is every moment we choose trust over fear, endurance over despair, love over indifference.

Jesus tells us, "By your endurance you will gain your lives." That is not a warning — it is a promise.
